





# Northland v Auckland Geographical size






#### Northland v Auckland Employment & Unemployment




#### Northland v Auckland GDP +GDP per employed persons




#### Northland v Auckland Productivity growth in Northland region and Auckland 2000-2015




### Northland v Auckland export orientation


#### **Exports as a share of GDP**




### Real Median weekly household income



#### Household income and percentage of population aged 25-64 years









- => Build it!






#### Auckland – Northland: Interconnectivity and mutually beneficial opportunities
