- 1. Shared visions drive local action & change

- 4. Building diverse & collaborative local leadership
- Working adaptively learning informs planning & action



Why CLD matters.....

- Limited gains from dominant deficit focused models that aim to 'fix' people
- 2. Increased integration & service coordination won't be enough
- Complex solutions best addressed by 'whole system' working together – especially resident/client voices.
- 4. Significant capacity in communities waiting to be un-leashed....



Funding Pyramid




