















A Crisis of Trust: USA






Trust in Australian Government

Levels of trust in government and politicians in Australia are at their lowest level since 1993


- Only five percent of Australians trust government
- 74 percent exhibit a critical perspective
- 25 percent trust government ministers
- 72 percent who trust the police
- 56 percent the judiciary











New Zealand Unemployment Rates



Combination of Complementary Knowledge

 Innovation stems most often from the <u>combination of complementary</u> <u>expertise</u>

Multiple stakeholders are needed to create and implement innovations

Partnerships are key

Cross-Sector Partnership and Capability: Victoria University of Wellington

Challenge:

- Creating Industry-ready talent in fast moving sectors
- Need for areas of growth

• <u>Solution</u>:

Strategic partnerships with corporation as a means to drive innovation



- A new state-of-the-art facility in the heart of Miramar's film sector set up in a collaboration between Victoria University, and Miramar Creative Ltd.
- It will be directed by Weta co-founder Jamie Selkirk, who won an Oscar for his work on the Lord of the Rings Trilogy.
- The facility houses Victoria University's Master of Fine Arts and Master of Design Technology degrees.

Mental Health: The Challenge

- 16% of New Zealanders have been diagnosed with a mental disorder at some time in their lives (including depression, bipolar disorder and/or anxiety disorder)
- Approximately 250,000 New Zealanders, are living with a disability caused by psychological and/or psychiatric conditions
- Mental illness and substance abuse issues cost New Zealand employers between
 \$79 and \$105 billion annually in indirect costs




